SCHOOL COMPETES TO SAVE SEAGRASS

Students from Brooklyn Public School were awarded with prizes and certificates for their outstanding entries in a competition to help raise awareness of Dangar Island's endangered seagrass bed.

The competition, My Favourite Seagrass Animal, was part of a joint program between Hornsby Council and the Hawkesbury Nepean Catchment Management Authority, called the Dangar Island Seagrass Protection and Education program. The program aims to protect an area of seagrass found off the southern side of Dangar Island.

To enter the competition, children drew their favourite seagrass animal and described how people could help to protect the seagrass bed.

Council's Environmental Scientist, Kristy Guise, said, "The children produced some fantastic artwork, and the winning entries had three simple messages that everyone can follow. These were; don't dig boat propellers or anchors into the seagrass bed; look for buoys that surround the seagrass and keep away; and tell other people about the importance of the seagrass bed."

"A wealth of talent was demonstrated in the students' entries, as well as an impressive knowledge of the Hawkesbury River," Kirsty said.

Third place in the primary section went to Bronwyn Peddley from Dangar Island.

Seagrass beds are unique habitats that provide a haven for animals such as juvenile fish, sea horses, pipefish and turtles. The Dangar Island seagrass bed is in danger from motor boats which are anchoring and using propellers within the area.

The NSW Maritime Authority has placed nine yellow marker buoys around the area to help locals and visitors identify where the seagrass bed is located.

The Dangar Island Seagrass Protection and Education program is funded by the Natural Heritage Trust through the Hawkesbury Nepean Catchment Management Authority.

DANGAR ISLAND RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

The (welcome) rain means that despite our best efforts we are unable to complete the hazard reduction planned for the southeastern sector of the Reserve. At the current rate I estimate that it will not be ready until well after Xmas. When it is dry and weather is favorable it will go ahead. Meanwhile, the rain offers residents an opportunity to get their properties ready for the hot dry days of January and February. The brochures that were distributed to every household earlier this year are a good guide to what needs to be done. When the weather is hot, dry and windy it is too late to begin protecting your property! The Brigade has a range of written material that can assist residents plan their clean-up.

Please also be aware that because it is the fire season permits are needed for hazard reduction. Please also be aware that while recreational fires are allowed, residents and visitors need to be aware of the requirements regarding size of fire, extinguishment and who should be in attendance. Shortterm renters recently had a recreational fire on the beach left a very hot patch of sand that could have burnt the feet of anyone walking on it. Recreational fires must be extinguished with water and must be attended at all times. The recent Advocate story about a resident who stayed at home after a cardiac event because they had misgivings about the boat trip to Brooklyn, is of concern. The Brigade has a number of highly trained first aid members and we are very skilled in taking sick and injured people to Brooklyn to meet an ambulance or assisting the ambulance to come to the resident. If you think you are having a heart attack or other serious illness we can assist you, but only if we know that vou need assistance. Do not be foolhardy and wait the pain out, when assistance is available.

We recently participated in a Rural Fire Service/Rural Fire Service Association Statewide Community Education Meeting held in the Community Hall. Our own Phillip Dogget presented a session about preparing houses for bushfire prevention and the committee was very impressed. They were very congratulatory about the activity of the Dangar Island Brigade in community education. Two members, Jonathan Sykes and Cybele Shorter recently passed their Advanced Fire Fighter Course. They have worked very hard to pass the course and we congratulate them on it. The Brigade wishes all residents a happy holiday break.


